

McFarland Ranch Directions from Sacramento

99 south to exit 275a Elm Avenue (heading west). After crossing railroad tracks Elm becomes Orr Road. When Orr Road turns left on a 15 mph curve, go straight into the Ranch, sign on right shoulder.

McFarland Ranch Directions from south of Sacramento

99 north to exit 275a Simmerhorn Road turn off.

Turn left onto Simmerhorn Road, then left onto N. Lincoln Way.

Turn right at first cross street Elm Avenue (heading west).

After crossing railroad tracks Elm becomes Orr Road.

When Orr Road turns left on a 15 mph curve, go straight into the Ranch, sign on right shoulder.
